

Reunions

Class of 1975 - 50 Year Anniversary

On Saturday, 18 October this year, the 1975 classes from Daramalan College and Catholic Girls High School (CGHS) held our 50 year class reunion at the Ainslie Football Club. Seventy two former students made up of 39 Daramalan boys, 27 CGHS girls, and 6 partners, attended, whilst many others couldn't attend due to other commitments. 1975 was the first of a few experimental years of co-education at Daramalan where the 6th Form CGHS girls would attend certain classes at Daramalan.

The genesis of forming our organising committee to plan the 50th reunion began in May 2024. **Myles Parker**, who had been the driving force behind all our previous reunions, was joined this time by **Greg Rees**, myself (**Anthony Taylor**), and **John Barrett**. Later, we combined efforts with alumnae from Catholic Girls High School.

As many of us hadn't seen each other for a long time, a series of events were planned from Friday to Sunday. A "Meet and Greet" at the Kingston Hotel on Friday night, a lake "Walk and Talk" on Saturday morning, school tours around midday on Saturday before the main event at the Ainslie Football Club on Saturday night, a Sunday Mass, and a farewell brunch. In true Dara tradition, the Kingston Hotel and Ainslie Football Club nights proved by far to be the most popular.

We created a playlist of 70 odd songs from 1969-1975 that played in the background over the night. Two slideshows were produced. The first to honour our classmates who have passed away both when we were at school and since we left. In all, 28 Daramalan classmates and 12 from CGHS have passed away. The second slideshow was a collection of images from school, past reunions, and other things, that ran on repeat over the course of the night.

It was a sensational night thoroughly enjoyed by everyone with plenty of noise, great music, pictures taken, and **John Barrett's** speech. We also appreciate Daramalan's and particularly **Arina'**s support in helping us put the reunion together. Notable attendees on the night were **Andrew Webster**, the 1975 School Captain, **John Barrett** and **Mick Flynn**, the 1975 School Vice-Captains, and **Dr Frank Brennan AM**. In addition, we had old classmates travel from New Zealand, Western Australia, Queensland, Victoria and various parts of NSW.

In the end, after room hire, food and other expenses, we achieved a surplus of \$250 which was split into \$125 donations to the Daramalan Scholarship Fund, and the Merici College Parents and Friends Association.




In Memoriam
